My sister has down syndrome and I love her to pieces.

Maybe I heard this story wrong, but I remember my
parents saying that early on in her life they had the choice
to ship her off to a home for kids with down syndrome. I'm
glad they didn't. I'm glad to have her in my life and to be
her big brother.

This just highlights one of those things that we often do in our society. We push people off to the fringes if they are outside the central part of our attention. We push people to the margins.

Thankfully, these people on the fringes of society do not remain in God's peripheral vision. He sees everyone all at once all the time. And he cares for each one as if they were the only one in the whole world; his care is personal. He sees and cares for the single mom who struggles to make ends meet. He sees and cares for the homeless person just trying scrape by. He sees and cares for the cancer patient who battles not just cancer but depression every day. He sees and cares for the drug addict who desperately wants to quit but finds himself/herself trapped by the addiction. He sees and cares for the poor, the desperate, the broken, the widow, the orphan, the abused, the enslaved, the elderly, those in nursing homes, those with mental illnesses, those with mental weaknesses.
